Mr. Mahoney was CEO of Monsanto for 13 years. Since his retirement, he has served as Distinguished Executive in Residence at the Center for the Study of American Business (now the Weidenbaum Center on the Economy, Government and Public Policy) at Washington University.

During his tenure as CEO he transformed Monsanto from a largely commodity chemical and agricultural specialties company into a broad-based life sciences and specialty chemical company with major programs in pharmaceuticals, food and nutritional ingredients, and world leadership in agricultural biotechnology and related activities.

In 2003 Mr. Mahoney published "In My Opinion" a collection of his writings on public policy, corporate strategy, management, trade and other topics. He currently hosts a conference for TV, radio and print journalists each summer at Cape Cod, sponsored by the Weidenbaum Center, covering broad topics of free enterprise, corporate governance and public policy and conducts seminars on the topic of Op-Ed writing at a summer writer's conference. Other activities include business consulting, teaching, lecturing, and various charitable activities. He has recently edited "The Quotable Winston Churchill" a book published on behalf of The Churchill Memorial and Library at Westminster College in Fulton, MO.
